1. Is there a pre-design report or project study for the new tank?  
*No. The reservoir is included in the existing and new water system plan, but no preliminary engineering studies have been made.*
2. Do the WSDOT forms and Business Licenses count towards the page count? It seems like those would be outside of the "qualifications," but I want to confirm.  
*No.*
3. Do we need to provide a Lewis County business license or City of Vader business license?  
*State business license.*
4. Will there be an opportunity to visit the site or an on-site meeting prior to the RFQ submission date?  
*No requisite on-site meeting is planned at this time because we are asking for submittals of qualifications not for project proposals.*
5. What kind of funding is available for the project?  
*Community Development Block Grant (CDBG).*
6. Who applied for the funding? Were there any assistance from consultants? If so, could you name them?  
*The grant application was prepared by the Lewis County Utility Services Manager.*
7. What is the available amount for the project including all other project funding sources?  
*\$730,000 with \$13,000 from local utility funds to partially support utility personnels' efforts.*
8. What is Lewis County's involvement in the water utility?  
*Lewis County owns the water utility which was given to us by Superior Court in the receivership process.*
9. What is the representation and identity of the individuals in the interview panel?  
*Unknown at this time, but it will likely will be comprised of county engineers experienced in project design, construction management and managing project consultants.*
10. Would there be representation from the City of Vader?  
*Unlikely as the water utility is county owned and project management will be by the county utility.*
11. Any special concerns about the project such as permitting and scheduling?  
*No. Everything is proceeding as planned. County personnel have project permitting experience.*
