

## **RFP for Countywide Annual Hydrologic, Hydraulic, and Geomorphic Services**

### **Questions and Answers**

Below are the questions asked and answers given pertaining to the Request for Proposals for Countywide Annual Hydrologic, Hydraulic, and Geomorphic Services from July 23, 2019 to August 6, 2019.

- 1) The RFP states “The proposal shall be limited to ten (10) pages (sheets of paper), double sided if needed.” Does this mean 20 pages of content on 10 double-sided sheets of paper, or 10 pages of content on 5 double-sided sheets of paper? Do you include any covers or cover letters in the page limit?

This means up to 20 pages of content on 10 double-sided sheets of paper. Any information provided including covers, cover letters, or resumes counts toward the page count.

- 2) What are you anticipated in regards to upcoming work? Is it anticipated that the consultant will be utilized to provide information necessary for design and permitting of upcoming grant funded fish passage structure? Do you anticipate needing any stormwater designs?

The County is anticipating that 0 rise analyses may be needed for upcoming road projects as well as potential bank protection designs should flooding occur. The County also anticipates utilizing the consultant for hydraulic, hydrologic, and geomorphic assessments to provide the data needed for engineering reports and permitting requirements of grant funded fish passable culverts. The County does not anticipate the need for stormwater designs.

- 3) Who will be reviewing the proposals?

It is anticipated that proposals will be reviewed by Tim Fife, the County Engineer, Malcolm Bowie, the Assistant County Engineer, and Ann Weckback, the Environmental Planner.
